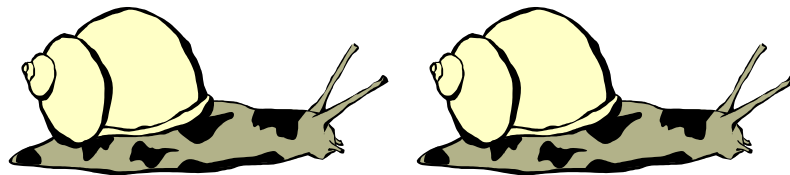

### **Sports Matters**

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> XI v Beachborough (A) Won**

The first outing of the season set off under leaden skies but the sun did shine and some good cricket was played. Beachborough may well have rued their decision to bat after their opener was returned to the pavilion after the very first ball from Sharok McD and a small collapse followed. However, they stuck to their task and made the most of the available time until tea. Of note for CCCS was BS who put on the gloves for the first time and displayed a natural talent and awareness.

After the interval Joe A-J and Ben S both started well and protected their wickets. As with the rest of the batting that followed we did not punish the bad balls – goodness knows there were as many as we gave Beachborough – and ran singles where a two was possible. Come the end it was fitting that Sharok McD was there to score the winning run. Ben E's captaincy developed over the afternoon and there was some promising bowling especially from Jacob B. However, man of the match goes to Ben 'Iron Gloves' S behind the stumps.

Plans to host the 6<sup>th</sup> Test Match at CCCS are again on hold due to concerns about tourists moving behind the bowler's arm but we will keep you informed.

Beachborough very sportingly declared and CCCS went into bat with a high possibility of a draw or a win but this was not to be.

Beachborough fielded a County-level bowler who pinned our batsmen down whilst on alternate overs a spin bowler came in to pick off our batsmen. Max A was our top scorer with 7 runs. With half an hour to go it became obvious that we could not win. Max A asked his team to go for a draw, the batsmen being asked to defend their wickets at all costs and not to risk losing the match. The clock ticked away, wickets were lost to good fielding and the result was CCCS all out for 31 runs.

Special mention to Joel C who kept wicket with a great deal of style and a safe pair of hands. Josh F, Frank K and Max A took two wickets apiece.

A final comment: CCCS fielded well, a draw could have been achieved through safe batting and concentration but well done, a very pleasing first outing of the season. **DC**
