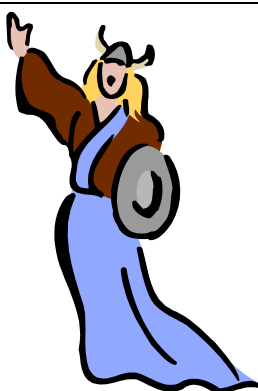
Photographs

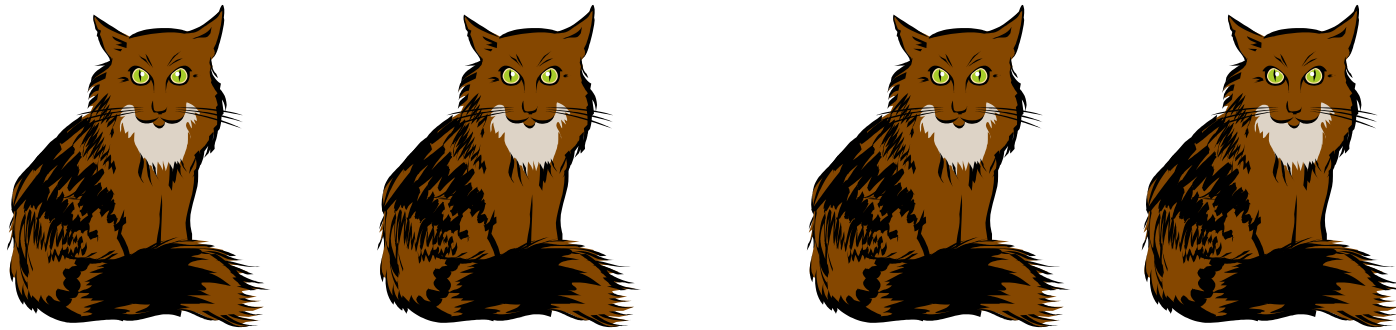

Sports Matters
